SPECIALIZED SERVICES

Hand and Wrist Problems

For birth and acquired hand and wrist conditions, we are nationally recognized for cutting-edge techniques and outstanding outcomes. We specialize in birth and developmental differences and trauma and sports-related injuries.

Hip Deformities

We care for problems of the hip identified at birth or presenting in young adults, providing both conservative and surgical treatment. Our Adolescent and Young Adult Hip Disorders Center is one of only a handful of orthopedic practices in the country with expertise in adolescent hip arthroscopy. A multidisciplinary approach focuses on relieving pain, improving function and preserving the hip joint in patients diagnosed with complex conditions such as developmental hip dysplasia, impingement disorders or deficient hip sockets.

Foot Deformities

Our physicians are internationally recognized for treating congenital pediatric foot deformities such as clubfoot, vertical talus, flatfoot, polydactyly, or metatarsus adductus.

Lower Extremity Deformities and Limb-Lengthening

We specialize in lower extremity deformities, including the correction of Blount's disease commonly caused by genu varum (bowed legs), and the treatment of uneven limb length in young children.

Musculoskeletal Oncology

A multidisciplinary approach is used to diagnose and treat children with benign and malignant tumors of the musculoskeletal system, including spinal tumors. A fellowship-trained orthopedic oncologist works closely with radiologists, pathologists, and pediatric oncologists to create an individualized treatment plan that aggressively treats the cancer while ensuring the highest quality of life for the patient.

Spinal Deformities

We are one of the world's leading programs for the treatment of spinal deformities and problems with the immature growing spine. Our surgeons are at the forefront in treating early onset and severe cases of scoliosis, kyphosis, and spondylolisthesis.

Trauma

St. Louis Children's Hospital is the only Level-1 pediatric trauma center in Missouri and Illinois verified by the American College of Surgeons. We are the only pediatric trauma service in the region that will re-attach and re-vascularize severed limbs.

Young Athlete Center

The Young Athlete Center provides sports medicine care for pediatric and adolescent athletes, evaluating and treating sports injuries (such as ACL and meniscus injuries), and sports-related concussions. Our physicians work closely with sports psychologists, cardiologists, dietitians, and other specialists to provide comprehensive care for the young athlete, including injury prevention education.

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
